



Minor in Global and Urban Education Studies

This 16-credit interdisciplinary minor introduces students from across the university to critical social, cultural, economic, political, legal, and policy issues in education. Courses examine the role of education not only in American society, but also in international urban and non-urban contexts.

Two study options:

- **Urban Education:** focus on equity, urban schools, youth identities, multicultural education, race and schooling, and related topics
- **Global Education:** focus on social, cultural, and economic aspects of globalization and their implications for education

Is this the Right Minor for You?

This minor is a great option if you're considering a career or graduate study in education, including:

- teaching
- education leadership or advocacy
- policymaking
- working in non-profit organizations or international non-governmental organizations
- working in government positions in the U.S. and abroad
- volunteering or working with the Peace Corps, Teach for America, Americorps, and similar programs

This minor is also appropriate if you're interested in graduate study in law, policy, the liberal arts, or business.

Who can declare this Minor?

The minor is open to undergraduate students throughout NYU.

How do I Apply for this Minor?

You must apply for the minor in Albert. When you submit an application for the minor, it will be reviewed by both your home school and the global and urban education studies minor, Dr. Cynthia Miller-Idriss. If it is approved, the minor will appear on your transcript.

If you are a Steinhardt student, you may not apply for this minor using the cross school minor application. You must use the Minor Declaration form which is available through your home department or the Steinhardt Office of Student Affairs.
