



Maximize Your Transfer Credits

Our articulation agreements allow you to transfer as many as 72 credits from your community college to a related program of study. To see exactly how your credits will transfer, you may request a preadmission transfer credit evaluation. Just fax a copy of your college transcript to 212 995 4328. Include your name, phone number, email address, and intended NYU major. We will tell you which of your courses will transfer and which courses you will need to complete at NYU. We can even suggest classes you can take while you're still at your community college.

CCTOP Students Excel at NYU

Many community college students express concern about whether they are academically prepared to succeed at NYU. More than 2,000 students have already transferred to the Steinhardt School through CCTOP. Based on their performance, we know that your community college record is a good predictor of academic performance at NYU.

Financing Your NYU Education

NYU is committed to trying to make it financially possible for all qualified students to attend. In order for the University to offer you a financial aid package, you must (1) file an admissions application and be offered admission; (2) file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and, if you are a New York State resident, a Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) form. Financial Aid packages typically include federal and state grants, NYU scholarships, and student loans. We strongly recommend that you apply for admission and financial aid so that you can have all the information you need to decide if NYU is affordable for you.

The CCTOP Scholarship Package

NYU Scholarship packages for CCTOP students range from \$8,000-\$22,500 a year. Students who transfer to NYU through the Community College Transfer Opportunity Program are considered for three scholarships:

- The CCTOP Scholarship
- The Steinhardt Scholarship
- The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

In order to be considered for the \$8,000 merit-based CCTOP Scholarship, you must be nominated by a transfer counselor or faculty member at a participating community college. Nomination forms are available in your community college's transfer office or online at www.steinhardt.nyu.edu/cctop. You may also request a nomination form by calling 212 998 5139. We offer CCTOP Scholarships to approximately 150 new transfer students every year.

Steinhardt Scholarships are awarded to CCTOP recipients on the basis of both need and merit. As long as you file a FAFSA form, you will be considered for a Steinhardt Scholarship. These awards range from \$1,000 to \$12,000 a year.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships are available to students who are members of Phi Theta Kappa and who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.8 or higher. Ask your PTK advisor to send a letter of nomination to: NYU Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 22 Washington Square North, New York, NY 10011-9191. PTK awards are \$2,500 a year.

You may receive one, two, or all three of these scholarships totaling \$8,000-\$22,500 a year.



Eligibility Requirements

You are eligible to transfer to NYU through the Community College Transfer Opportunity Program if you are currently attending one of the participating community colleges, have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher, have at least 48 transferable credits, and intend to study full time in the Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development. You must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident in order to receive any of these awards.
