Pedro Noguera, PhD, is a professor in the Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development at NYU. An urban sociologist, Noguera's scholarship and research focuses on the ways in which schools are influenced by social and economic conditions in the urban environment. He has written many articles and edited several books on the research associated with closing the achievement gap in our schools.

As Executive Director of the Metropolitan Center for Urban Education, Dr. Noguera also oversees the center's Technical Assistance Center on Disproportionality. The mission of this project is to provide technical assistance, resources and professional development to NYS school districts to assist them in revising policies, procedures and/or instructional and other practices that resulted in a disproportionate representation of racial and ethnic groups in special education. TACD focuses on building cultural competence and leadership development through turnkey training with districts, regions and state administrators.
