## TEACHING

*One major mentoring work I took on in 2018 was to serve as the Guest Editor for the Translational Issues in Psychological Science’s Special Issue on Refugee and Immigrant Issues (March, 2019, Vol 5, no. 1). This journal is an APA journal for students, where each issue concentrates on a single important, timely, and/or potentially controversial theme in translational science that is of broad interest to scientists, practitioners, and the general public. A senior scholar is invited to serve as a guest editor, who is tasked with writing a call for papers, selecting a graduate student associate editorial board, and overseeing and mentoring graduate student editors in the process of serving as action editors for a peer-reviewed journal. All submitted manuscripts for this journal must also have at least one student author and a senior author. In the process, our special issue received 20 submissions, and I guided the three graduate student associate editors through the process of selecting (and working through multiple revise-and-resubmit cycles) of 8 papers that were ultimately included in the issue. We also co-authored an introduction to the special issue. It was an enormously time-consuming but a rewarding mentoring project.*
