Teaching:

Revision of Ph.D. course: I integrated the Seminar in Counseling Theory and Research and the Seminar in Vocational Theory and Research into a single doctoral seminar. This was enabled by my recent scholarship to develop a metatheory for counseling and vocational theory that I refer to as counseling/psychotherapy.

I developed (Spring 2018) and taught (Summer, 2018) the online course in the Dynamics of Vocational Development.

I served as the course lead (Fall, 2019) for the online sections of the Foundations of Counseling for Mental Health and Wellness.

I developed the basic templates (schematic syllabi) for the two introductory residential courses in the Counseling for Mental Health and Wellness Program - the foundations and professional orientation courses.

I regularly advise students in my courses as well as the approximately 20 M.A. students assigned to me as mentees regarding a range of professional issues. I write about 5-10 recommendations per year for students applying for advanced degree programs, internships, jobs, etc.

I served on the Ph.D. committee of one doctoral student who defended her dissertation and graduated in Spring 2018.
