The Mitchell Leaska Dissertation Research Award supports the financial needs of doctoral student’s research as they near completion of their dissertation. A \$5,000 stipend will be awarded to one recipient per semester, excluding summer.

Eligibility: Awards are available to students whose doctoral programs are in applied psychology (counseling, developmental, PSI), educational sociology, social studies education, mathematics education, or science education. If you are not enrolled in one of these programs, then you must provide additional justification as to how your research is related to one of these fields. Applicants must also have an approved dissertation proposal and not currently be the recipient of other doctoral funding.

- Synopsis of Dissertation Proposal (6 page limit including references, double spaced, 1 inch margins, Arial font, 12 point)
 - The following sections should be included:
 - Background and Significance
 - Methodology
 - Project Execution, Timeline, and Dissemination
- IRB Approval Letter with applicant’s name as being approved
- Timeline for completion of dissertation (1 page limit, double spaced, 1 inch margins, Arial font, 12 point)
- Budget and Budget Narrative (1 page limit, double spaced, 1 inch margins, Arial font, 12 point)
- One letter of support from either your dissertation chair or from one other individual who is not a member of the dissertation committee, but who is familiar with your work (1 page limit)

Deadlines: Applications must be submitted no later than October 15 (fall award) and March 1 (spring award).
